These men considered the future of Ireland to be an extension of the British state, as seen in the salon at Bryskett's Cottage, outside Dublin, where guests met to pore over the Irish Question . But such deliberations were rewarded by no final triumph, only debilitating warfare that stretched the entire length of Elizabeth's rule.
